India's cases & deaths in May most in world for any month

Monday's Death Toll Is Lowest Since April 22

India's Covid ordeal in May was the worst witnessed in any country for any month since the beginning of the pandemic, both in terms of the absolute number of cases and fatalities. The month, however, ended on a note of relief, with less than 1.3 lakh fresh cases reported on Monday, the lowest daily tally in 54 days

and the first time since April 9 that less than 1.5 lakh infections were recorded in the country. The day's death toll was below 2,500 (not counting 386 previous deaths added to Maharashtra's tally), the lowest since April 22. India recorded nearly 90.3 lakh Covid cases in May, far the highest month in the country reported in any country so far. Although infections steadily declined through the second half of the month, the numbers overall were so high that the case count in May was 30% higher than the previous record of 69.4 lakh, also reported in India in the month of April. The worst month of the pandemic in the US was December, when the country recorded 65.3 lakh cases, as per worldometers.info. In total cases per million, however, the US count is 302.202, five times higher than India's (20.144). The death toll from the pandemic in May was grim: India officially recorded nearly 1.2 lakh fatalities during the month (over 1.19,000), which was 2.5 times the toll reported in the country in April (46,788).

ICMR launches nationwide test of vaccine efficacy

Pune: The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), along with the Chemical-based National Institute of Epidemiology (NIE), has launched a nationwide study to determine vaccine effectiveness in preventing severe Covid-19 infection, reports Nisha Nambiar.

Nigeria-linked strain found in Telangana

A analysis of the SARS-CoV-2 virus has revealed that the B.1525 variant, which was reported in the United Kingdom in February this year, has a presence in Telangana. Enlisted as a senior scientist with the team said the research will help determine true vaccine ability amid reports of people testing positive (even hospitalised with Covid) after inoculation.

In Etawah, vax cert must to buy liquor

Etawah: Liquor stores in Safai of Uttar Pradesh's Etawah district have started to sell liquor only to people who have been vaccinated against Covid-19 and produced certificates. "We are selling liquor only after checking the Covid vaccination certificate of the customer," a shopkeeper says.

A sign outside his store reads, "Liquor will only be available to those who have been vaccinated (against Covid-19)". When asked about instructions regarding the same, district excise officer Kamal Kumar Shukla said that no such order has been issued by the government. "No such order has been issued. The sub-divisional magistrate might have asked liquor sellers to motivate people to get vaccinated," he said.

2 dead sr citizens 'vaccinated' in Guj

Vadodra: In Dahod district, family members of an elderly man and another elderly woman, who are no more, got messages attesting to their vaccination, on Sunday.

EPFO allows members to withdraw second Covid-19 advance

New Delhi: The government on Monday said it has allowed members of Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) has been permitted to withdraw a second non-refundable Covid-19 advance from the pension fund in the light of the economic impact of the second wave.

A provision for special withdrawal of EPFO funds was introduced by the government in March last year under the PM Garib Kalyan Yojana (PMKCY). The scheme had allowed non-refundable withdrawal of funds to the extent of basic wages and dearness allowances for three months, or up to 75% of the amount standing to member's credit in the EPF account. Labour ministry sources said the Covid-19 advance facility has been availed by nearly 76.31 lakh applicants.
