Carbon emissions at Delhi airport lowest since 2010

NEW DELHI: The use of solar power, natural lights and CNG vehicle has led to lowest carbon emission per passenger at Delhi airport since 2010. The Delhi airport, which handles almost 1,100 flights in a day, highest in the country, has reduced emission (kg CO₂/passenger) by 91 per cent since 2010-11 to 2017-18.

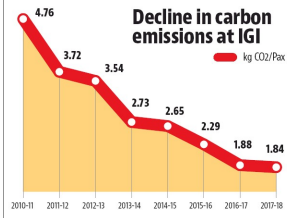
Although the passenger movement and aircraft movement has doubled since 2010-11, carbon emission per passenger has reduced to 1.84 in 2017-18 from 4.76 in 2010-11 and 2.29 in 2015-16. "As part of our environmental sustainability strategy, we have taken various efficiency measures at Delhi airport. These include solar power generation, successful registration on energy efficiency with UNNECO, clean development mechanism and achievement of the neutrality level in the airport carbon accreditation programme. At Delhi Airport we strongly believe that the collaborative approach is the key strategic element for combating climate change," said a spokesperson for Delhi International Airport Limited (DIAL).

Since its inception, the 72MW solar power plant on the airside has generated more than 30,000 MW of power, reducing more than 25,000 tonnes of CO₂ emission. DIAL plans to increase the capacity to 200 MW.

"Major reasons for carbon emission are power consumption, generator set, which are used in emergency and vehicle at the airside. These can be controlled by Delhi airport while the emission from aircraft has to be controlled by respective airline. But through collaborative decision making, which gives queue number to planes so that it doesn't have to wait with engine on, has helped in reducing carbon emission at the airside also," said an airport official, who is familiar with the matter.

From 142,282 tonnes CO₂ emission in 2010-11, it has reduced to 107,245 tonnes in 2016-17. "Multimodal connectivity through metro rail and public transport facility to reduce vehicle congestion and traffic emission has also helped a lot. Use of battery operated vehicle and CNG vehicle is also among the reasons for achieving the target," the official added.

DIAL has also introduced energy efficient lighting system and building management system to consume less power and use more natural lights. Delhi airport is the first airport in Asia Pacific to be carbon neutral and it has an extensive model for reducing the green house gas emissions," said DIAL official.

25-year-old shot dead after he tries to intervene in street fight

NEW DELHI: A 25-year-old man was killed and his friend was injured in northeast Delhi's Seelampur on Monday night when the duo intervened in a street fight that involved the latter's brother.

Police have found that one of the alleged accused involved in the case was out on parole in a murder case. The deceased was identified as Salman, a resident of Seelampur, who was taking a late-night stroll with his friend, Mukim, near their residence. According to the police, around 10 pm, the duo saw two men fighting with Nazem near a mosque.

"Seeing Nazem in trouble, Mukim rushed to help and Salman followed him. Both of them asked the other two men to leave Nazem alone, but the fight escalated. One of the men took out a pistol and shot Salman twice. The two were later identified as Moimuddin and his younger brother Shabaz," a police officer said.

Police said Shabaz had shot at Salman and seeing the victim collapse, both Shabaz and Moimuddin fled from the spot. Salman was rushed to a hospital where he was declared brought dead.

Deputy commissioner of police (northeast), Atul Thakur said, primary probe revealed that Moimuddin was out on parole in a murder case. "Raids were conducted and he was arrested. Police teams are raiding several hideouts of Shabaz. We have possible leads and he will be arrested soon," Thakur said. Police said, Salman worked as an air condition mechanic. He was the youngest in his family, and had two brothers and a sister, while Mukim has eight brothers and one sister, who is married.

HRD ministry asks DU to fill up posts of principals

NEW DELHI: The Delhi University has been asked by the Human Resource Ministry to fill up posts of permanent principals in 21 colleges, including Jai Prakash Narayan. The ministry held a meeting with vice-chancellor Yogesh Tyagi and chairman of University Grants Commission, D P Singh, on Tuesday.

The university recently started its admission process for undergraduate, postgraduate and research courses. The new academic session of 63 DU colleges is likely to start from July 16. "The government has emphasised the need for filling up posts of principals in 21 DU colleges in the interest of academic progress. Since these are all grant-in-aid colleges, government expects better administration. All colleges have agreed for the suggestion and promised to complete by 15th July," an official from the ministry said.

An official explained that permanent principals play an important role in taking administrative decisions. "The HRD minister has also been emphasising on filling up teaching posts in DU," the official said. This exercise is linked to improving the NAAC rating of DU, which will also help it in applying for graded autonomy.
