 - d. Nitrogen Oxides [NO_x] (24 hrs. Basis) 80 μg/m³
 - e. Carbon Monoxide [CO] (8 hrs. Basis) 2000 μg/m³
- 3. The industry shall take adequate measures for control of noise level generated from industrial activities within the premises less than 75 dB(A) during day time and 70 dB(A) during night time.
- 4. Industry/Unit shall provide with each stack port hole with safe platform of 1 meter width with support & spiral ladder/ Stepped ladder with hand rail up to monitoring platform as per specifications given in part-III emission regulation of CPCB. In no case monkey ladder shall be allowed as stack monitoring facility.
- 5. The industry/unit shall make the necessary arrangements for control of the fugitive emission from any source of emission/section/activities.

- 8. If the industry comes in such a category where insurance under Public Liability Insurance Act is necessary, the industry will comply with provisions and submit a copy of the policy to the Board.
- 9. The information regarding quantity of hazardous wastes generated and its analysis report should be sent to the Board once in a year.
- 10. The authorized officer shall keep records of analysis of wastes or other relevant findings for at least three years from the date of dispatch of the waste for treatment, storage or disposal.
- 11. The utilization of hazardous waste as a supplementary resource or for energy recovery or after processing shall be carried out by the units only after obtaining approval from the Central Pollution Control Board.
- 12. The occupier generating the hazardous wastes, specified in Schedule-IV may sell it only to the recycler having a valid registration from the Central Pollution Control Board/State Pollution Control Board for recycling or recovery.
- 13. The occupier shall be responsible for safe and environmentally sound handling of hazardous wastes generated in his establishment.
- 14. The hazardous wastes generated in the establishment of an occupier shall be sent or sold to a recycler or re-processor or re-user registered or authorized under these rules or shall be disposed off in an authorized disposal facility.
- 15. The occupier shall take all adequate steps while handling hazardous wastes to contain contaminants and prevent accidents and limit their consequences on human beings and the environment and provide persons working on the site with the training, equipment and the information necessary to ensure their safety.
- 16. In case of transport of hazardous wastes for final disposal to a facility for treatment, storage and disposal existing in a State other than the State where the hazardous waste is generated, the occupier shall obtain 'No Objection Certificate' from the State Pollution Control Board of both the States.

Storage & Disposal of Hazardous wastes

23. The occupier, recyclers, re-processors, re-users, and operators of facilities may store the hazardous wastes for a period not exceeding ninety days and shall maintain a record of sale, transfer, storage, recycling and reprocessing of such wastes and make these records available for inspection.

Packing, Labeling & Transportation of Hazardous wastes

- 24. (i) The occupier or operator of the Treatment, Storage and Disposal Facility or recycler shall ensure that the hazardous waste are packaged and labeled, based on the composition in a manner suitable for safe handling, storage and transport as per the guidelines issued by the Central Pollution Control Board vide October 2004 & conditions issues from time to time.

'Prioritise MP and MLA criminal cases'

New Delhi: Delhi high ocurt has asked its judges to prioritise hearing of all criminal cases, appeals and revisions concerning MPs and MLAs so that the cases can be decided expeditionsly and effectively.

A division bench of acting Chief Justice Manmohan and Justice Manmeet Pritam Singh Arora passed the order while dealing with a suo motu PIL te monitor cases pending against MPs and MLAs in trial courts as well as the high court. The matter will



Industrial liquor row: UP, WB on same page, Kerala differs

Lawyers' Views Not Intoxicating For Kerala Counsel: SC Judge

New Delhi: Urtar Pradesh and Bengal, governed by political rivals BJP and TMC, displayed spectacular bonbomie: in Supreme Court Wednesday when it came to controlling revenue rich liquor industry and pleaded for ousting centralgovt scole by arguing that when all kinds of alcohols are intexicating liquor, constitutionally states alone would have jurisdiction over it.

"Intoxicating means every kind of alcohol, whether for human consumption or industrial use. Universal regulating provision for liquor is Entry 8 of List II. When an exhaustive entry constitutionally puts the subject under state's purview, Centre cannot through an exception under Entry 52 of List II denude the overarching control vested in states over liquor industry" argued senior advocate Arvind Datar, who along with Dinesh Dwivedi appeared for UP.

West Bengal through senier advocate Jaideep Gupta. told a bench of CJID Y Chandrachud and Justices Ilrishikesh Roy, A S Oka, B V Nagarathna, J.B. Pardiwala, Manoj Misra, Iljial Bhuyan, S.C. Sharma & A G Masih that the only issue before SC is who— Centre or state

He said, "Most processes for manufacture of denatured. spirits is the same as potable alcohol, over which states have exclusive control under Entry 8 of List II. Up to extra neutral alcohol (ENA), the process is the same. If states decide at that stage that no raw material would be diverted for industrial alcohol manufacture, then ENA would be used only for potable liquor."

West Bengal adopted the chart on manufacturing process for potable liquor and industrial alcohol, which was placed on record of the court by Datar on behalf of UP. However, attorney general R Venkataramani and selicitor general Tushar Mehta said Centre would on Thursday argue that Entry 8. List II, is confined only to potable liquor

The bonhomie between states, irrespective of their political rivalry was ruptured by Left-governed Kerala, which through senior advocate V Giri surprised the bench by arguing that the southern state is interested in getting exclusive control only over potable liquor and not industrial alcohol.

"We have nothing to do with denatured spirits," declared Kerala, prompting the bench to put theoretical questions about its stand being incongruous to the pleadings of UP and WB. Gii said, "Ladopt the stand of UP, except that Kerala does not lay claim to centrol and

regulate denatured spirits." In a lighter vein, Justice Okasaid, 'Arguments of Dwivedi and Datar are not intoxicating for Giri." Justice Roy joined in and said, "According to Kerala, Entry 8 (List II) kicks in only when the drinks given kick."

Man accused of paper leaks held in exam probe

After 33 years, 3 freed Rajiv case convicts return to Lanka

Chennai: After a gap of 33 years, three freed convicts in the Rajiv Gandhi assassination case - V Sribaran alias Murugan, Robert Payas and Jayakumar landed in Colombo Wednesday morning and later proceeded to their hometown Jaffna.

Sri Lankan immigration officials held an inquiry with them for about three hours fellowing their arrival from Chennai.

The trio spent another five hours with CID personnel, and answered all queries, said their lawyer P Pugalenthi, who also accompanied them to Sri Lanka

"To the officials' accusation that they had left the island nation illegally in 1991. we explained how a war-like situation forced them to flee and that there was no time to adhere to procedural formalities. On their part, at the end of the five-hour inquiry CID found that there were no case pending against any of them in Sri Lanka. They were therefore, allowed to leave and proceed to Jaffna," Pugalenthi told TOL

Asked about Sriharan's plan to seek asylum in UK and reunite with his daughter, and the apprehension expressed in Madras IIC that his life would be in danger if he returned to Lanka, Pagalenthi said the Sri Lankan deputy high commission in Chennai gave all the three only a normal passport.

"Regular passport warrants them to return to Sri Lanka and then pursue their visa options. There was no way except to return to Sri Lanka," Pugalenthi said.

Police seizures, which began as the model code of conduct came into force, show Karnataka is clearly a step or two ahead of most states when it comes to giving below the table incentives

Venkatesh Kumar, additional chief election officer, Karnataka, told TOI seizures show alongside the new freebies the old faithfuls are also being handed out - cookers, mixers, saris, churidars, dupattas and trou-

Bidar, Shivamogga, Chikkamagaluru, and Kalaburagi districts top this ingiorious list. Police haul of freehies in Shivamogga included grocery hampers of rice and ragi bags, salt

and oil packets. Per Venkatesh, "Groceries are big among the seizures this time. Groceries are packed in boxes and kept for distribution across various godowns." Obviously, there are no bills attached. Even Bengaluru district has seen a spike in the use of groceries



as voter inducements.

'Prioritise MP and MLA criminal cases'

New Delhi: Delhi high ocurt has asked its judges to prioritise hearing of all criminal cases, appeals and revisions concerning MPs and MLAs so that the cases can be decided expeditionsly and effectively.

A division bench of acting Chief Justice Manmohan and Justice Manmeet Pritam Singh Arora passed the order while dealing with a suo motu PIL te monitor cases pending against MPs and MLAs in trial courts as well as the high court. The matter will

be heard on May 20. The court also asked its registry to reallocate or redistribute cases pending before a single judge of the court in which an order of stay of trial has been passed. and the stay is continuing for more than six months. There are 34 such cases.

This is to ensure that the stay applications are disposed of in the subject cases expeditiously and trial of such cases can conclude before the designated special courts," the court said in its

Further, directing the

registry to circulate the judgment among judges of the high court, the bench said, "In line with the directives passed by Hon'ble Chief Justice of India in WP(C) No 099 of 2016 titled as Ashwini Kumar Upadhyay vs. Union of India & Anr. we direct the registry of this court to circulate this order among brother and sister judges assigned with such

cases so that priority is given to all criminal cases/appeals/revisions pending before them against members of Parliament and legislative assem-

blies as it is essential for expeditious and effective disposal of such cases."

With respect to cases pending before district courts, the high court directed special MP/MLA courts to first give priority to those cases against legislators which are punishable by death or life imprisonment, subsequently to cases punishable with imprisonment for five years or more and then hear other cases. 

Industrial liquor row: UP, WB on same page, Kerala differs

Lawyers' Views Not Intoxicating For Kerala Counsel: SC Judge

New Delhi: Urtar Pradesh and Bengal, governed by political rivals BJP and TMC, displayed spectacular bonbomie: in Supreme Court Wednesday when it came to controlling revenue rich liquor industry and pleaded for ousting centralgovt scole by arguing that when all kinds of alcohols are intexicating liquor, constitutionally states alone would have jurisdiction over it.

"Intoxicating means every kind of alcohol, whether for human consumption or industrial use. Universal regulating provision for liquor is Entry 8 of List II. When an exhaustive entry constitutionally puts the subject under state's purview, Centre cannot through an exception under Entry 52 of List II denude the overarching control vested in states over liquor industry" argued senior advocate Arvind Datar, who along with Dinesh Dwivedi appeared for UP.

West Bengal through senier advocate Jaideep Gupta. told a bench of CJID Y Chandrachud and Justices Ilrishikesh Roy, A S Oka, B V Nagarathna, J.B. Pardiwala, Manoj Misra, Iljial Bhuyan, S.C. Sharma & A G Masih that the only issue before SC is who— Centre or state

He said, "Most processes for manufacture of denatured. spirits is the same as potable alcohol, over which states have exclusive control under Entry 8 of List II. Up to extra neutral alcohol (ENA), the process is the same. If states decide at that stage that no raw material would be diverted for industrial alcohol manufacture, then ENA would be used only for potable liquor."

West Bengal adopted the chart on manufacturing process for potable liquor and industrial alcohol, which was placed on record of the court by Datar on behalf of UP. However, attorney general R Venkataramani and selicitor general Tushar Mehta said Centre would on Thursday argue that Entry 8. List II, is confined only to potable liquor

The bonhomie between states, irrespective of their political rivalry was ruptured by Left-governed Kerala, which through senior advocate V Giri surprised the bench by arguing that the southern state is interested in getting exclusive control only over potable liquor and not industrial alcohol.

"We have nothing to do with denatured spirits," declared Kerala, prompting the bench to put theoretical questions about its stand being incongruous to the pleadings of UP and WB. Gii said, "Ladopt the stand of UP, except that Kerala does not lay claim to centrol and

regulate denatured spirits." In a lighter vein, Justice Okasaid, 'Arguments of Dwivedi and Datar are not intoxicating for Giri." Justice Roy joined in and said, "According to Kerala, Entry 8 (List II) kicks in only when the drinks given kick."

After 33 years, 3 freed Rajiv case convicts return to Lanka

Chennai: After a gap of 33 years, three freed convicts in the Rajiv Gandhi assassination case - V Sribaran alias Murugan, Robert Payas and Jayakumar landed in Colombo Wednesday morning and later proceeded to their hometown Jaffna.

The trio spent another five hours with CID personnel, and answered all queries, said their lawyer P Pugalenthi, who also accompanied them to Sri Lanka

"To the officials' accusation that they had left the island nation illegally in 1991. we explained how a war-like situation forced them to flee and that there was no time to adhere to procedural formalities. They were therefore, allowed to leave and proceed to Jaffna," Pugalenthi told TOL

Asked about Sriharan's plan to seek asylum in UK and reunite with his daughter, and the apprehension expressed in Madras IIC that his life would be in danger if he returned to Lanka, Pagalenthi said the Sri Lankan deputy high commission in Chennai gave all the three only a normal passport.

"Regular passport warrants them to return to Sri Lanka and then pursue their visa options. There was no way except to return to Sri Lanka," Pugalenthi said.






