CRACK REPAIR | Officials promise to repair road by Sat night after uproar

Atal Setu ramp fix on: MMRDA

The Mumbai Metropolitan Region Development Authority (MMRDA) said on Saturday that the repair work on the approach ramp to the Mumbai Trans Harbour Link (MTHL), also known as Atal Setu, was in full swing and would be completed by night.

The work started on Friday night after an inspection by the MMRDA's operation and maintenance teams, officials said.

Built at a cost of Rs17,840 crore, the six-lane bridge is 21.8 kilometres long with a 16.5km sea link connecting south Mumbai and Navi Mumbai.

In the past couple of days, there were reports that the Atal Setu had developed cracks, following which Maharashtra Congress president Nana Patole went to the spot for an inspection on Friday.

The MMRDA reiterated that



"the cracks on the approach road from Ulwe (Navi Mumbai side) are minor and located along the edge of the road".

It added that the re-patch work on the cracks – detected at three locations – had been taken up without disrupting the MTHL traffic.

The MMRDA also said that contrary to the rumours, the cracks were not on the MTHL

bridge, but on the approach ramp towards Mumbai on the Navi Mumbai end.

"The cracks on Ramp 5 are minor longitudinal cracks in the asphalt pavement and do not indicate any structural defects," the MMRDA said.

Shed falls on football turf; 7 kids hurt

Seven young footballers were injured after a terrace shed of a seven-storey building in Thane came crashing on to the turf due to rain and wind on Friday. The incident took place at Gawand Park, Upvan, at 9.30pm. The injured children, all aged under 17, were rushed to a hospital with head injuries. Two of them are admitted to the ICU.

Regional Disaster Management Cell chief Yasin Tadvi said 17 students were playing football at the time of the incident. The injured are Shubhan Karpe, 15, Aryan Iyer, 15, Siddhant Ravasiya, 15, Abhigyan, 15, Ethan Gonsalves, and Ayyan Khan, 15, and Archit. Ethan and Ayan are in the ICU.

Officials said they are conducting a probe whether the building had permission to construct a shed on the terrace, and if a structural audit had been conducted.

Boy dies after falling into pit

A five-year-old boy died after falling into a water-filled pit at a construction site earmarked for a biogas plant in Kashimira.

The incident was reported from behind the Jijamata Municipal Garden in Penkarpada area on Friday evening.

Shreyansh Monu Soni, an only child, lived with his parents, paternal uncle and aunt, and cousins in a tenement in Jai Ambe Nagar, near Shiv Shakthi Nagar area. His father runs a pan stall in Dadar.

Shreyansh returned from school and went out to play at around 4pm. When he did not return, his family and neighbours started searching for him.

Finally, they found him in the water-filled pit. Shreyansh was pulled out of the pit by fire brigade personnel and taken to the civil hospital in Bhayandar, where he was declared dead on arrival at around 9pm.

The child apparently went to fetch his ball near the pit

when he fell into it.

According to locals, the pit was left unguarded by the contractual agency appointed by the civic administration. The construction work was lying idle for several months, they

The parents, residents and former municipal corporator Anita Patil blamed the civic administration for Shreyansh's death. The parents initially refused to take custody of the body for the final rites, but relented after the intervention of police officials.

"We have registered a case. An investigation is underway and documents are being scrutinised to ascertain the role of the officials / supervisors and the contractual agency responsible for the act of negligence," an official said.

College 'cheats' 762 SC students

Principal booked after college charges students development fee

The Social Justice and Special Assessment Department of the state has registered a case against a Vashi-based college for cheating 762 Scheduled Caste students by levying development fee from them between 2015 and 2021.

The initial complaint was made by the Ambedkar Student Association around three years with the Ministry of Social Justice. The association had complained about the college levying development fees from 762 SC students. The complaint said the college was alleged to have amassed a sum of Rs5.2 lakh from fees. As per the constitutional provision granted to the Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students, such fees are not to

be levied from them.

Three years ago, some students from the college based out of Sector 9 A in Vashi had approached the Ambedkar Student Association and provided the fee receipts. The office bearers of the organisation then obtained information through the Right to Information Act, and they found that the college had in total levied Rs5.2 lakh from the students in six years.

The association then lodged a complaint with the Thane assistant social welfare officer. Accordingly, when the Social Welfare Department investigated, they found the allegations to be correct and Thane Assistant Commissioner Ganesh Pawar gave written complaint to Vashi police, who registered a case on June 20 against the principal.
