NEW POLICY ROLLS OUT ON OCT 2

Over 25,000 buildings to get OCs, says Shelar

Buildings stalled for changes in policies will be regularised

THE STATE government will frame a policy to grant occupation certificates (OC) to more than 25,000 buildings constructed under the Development Control Regulations of the BMC, MHADA, SRA and other authorities, which for various reasons had not received OCs until now, Guardian Minister for Mumbai, Ashish Shelar, said on Thursday.

The decision was taken during a joint meeting of the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation, Urban Development Department, Revenue Department and Cooperation Department, he said.

For lakhs of Mumbai, this decision assumes significance as despite residing in their own homes for many years, they have been legally considered 'unauthorised occupants'.

The fault did not lie with the residents but arose due to loopholes in past regulations or lapses on the part of developers. According to Shelar, "To address this, the Urban Development Department will roll out a new policy from October 2."

Under this policy, he said, "technical or administrative lapses made during construction will be rectified, and buildings will be granted OCs through a simplified process."

Similarly, buildings that were denied OCs due to issues such as differences in sanctioned floor area, setback-related hurdles, etc., will also get relief, he said.

Further, he noted that buildings stalled due to changes in regulations or policies will also be regularised. Even in cases where citizens faced difficulties because developers failed to

hand over reserved areas/flats to the administration, the path for granting OCs will be opened. The process will be implemented transparently through an online system.

Housing societies are encouraged to take the initiative to apply for OCs. Under the new policy, societies may apply jointly or individually, and a partial OC (Part-OC) can also be obtained. If any building applies for an OC or Part-OC within the first six months, no penalty will be levied. However, if additional ISI has been used, the required premium will have to be paid.

26 schemes fail to garner interest, BMC invites fresh EOIs

FIVE MONTHS since the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) floated an Expression of Interest (EOI) for slum development schemes in 64 civic plots across Mumbai, the civic body on Thursday floated a fresh EOI for 26 schemes which failed to garner a response in the previous tender. According to senior civic officials, the maximum number of these 26 plots fall under the M/East ward which encompasses Deonar, Mankhurd and Govandi.

After deciding to lease its land parcels to private entities to generate revenue, the BMC in May had floated a tender to rope in eligible developers to undertake redevelopment and rehabilitation across 64 plots owned by the BMC. The contractors appointed for the project will be tasked with executing all responsibilities, such as survey of slums, planning and preparation of the project, securing permission and no-objection certificate, construction of the tenements as well as their maintenance post construction.

While the civic body had floated the EOI for 64 plots across 11 wards, the response was lukewarm. Only 38 bids were received for nearly 29 schemes. Meanwhile, of the 29 schemes, nearly eight slum parcels received a response only from a single bidder.

According to senior civic officials, the 29 schemes which drew responses to the bid arose situated primarily in the western suburbs including in Borivali, Andheri, Worli while some land parcels are situated in the eastern suburbs 'T' ward.

For the 26 parcels that did not receive adequate response including the eight parcels which received only single bids, the BMC on Thursday floated afresh a new EOI calling experienced and eligible entities to execute

redevelopment of slum schemes on these civic lands.


The highest number of land parcels which did not receive any response from the bidders are situated in the M/East ward, which is home to the Low Income Groups (LIG). "Amongst the several possible causes for the lack of adequate responses from the bidders could be the potential of land or the larger density of encroachments which makes the process more difficult," a civic source told Express.

Meanwhile, the civic body is currently scrutinising the bids received for the remaining of 21 schemes. Data shows that the BMC has shortlisted 93 responsive bidders from 25 companies for the 21 schemes.

Overall, the municipal lands which have been opened for re-

habilitation projects by developers spans over 8.37 lakh square metres and encompasses nearly 49,000 slum structures.

The EOI document will be made available on the BMC website on September 15, while the final date of submission has been set at September 30.

Thunderstorms, heavy rain likely: Fresh yellow alert sounded in city

IN A respite from the high temperatures, Mumbai is slated to experience a resurgence in rains over the weekend, with the India Meteorological Department (IMD) sounding a fresh yellow alert in the city and its neighbouring districts between Saturday and Sunday.

After experiencing a rainy Ganesh Chaturthi, rain is expected to be considerably in the city since Monday. Records show that between Wednesday and Thursday morning, the suburban Santacruz station and Colaba coastal observatory clocked in 101 mm rainfall.

In the absence of showers, temperatures soared significantly across the city. On Thursday, maximum temperatures touched 31.5 degrees in the suburbs, while in the island city division, temperatures spiked to 31.2 degrees as rain continued to elude the city. For three consecutive days, day time temperatures surpassed 31 degrees, leaving the city sweltering.

In what will likely spur a dip in temperatures, the weather bureau forecast heavy showers in the city over the weekend.

In its latest forecast bulletin, IMD has placed Mumbai and Thane districts under a yellow alert for two days, starting Saturday, and the possibility of thunderstorms coupled with heavy rainfall and gusty winds. Meanwhile, Raigad and Ratnagiri districts have been placed under an orange alert during the weekend owing to likely heavy to very heavy rainfall.

For Mumbai, September is the driest and the last monsoon season month, with the city typically receiving 359.6 mm rain during the month. The city's suburban station has received nearly 120 mm this month.

Drug kingpin's assets worth Rs 10.07 cr seized


Mumbai: The Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) has attached assets worth Rs 10.07 crore of Navin Chikkar, alleged kingpin of an international syndicate involved in the smuggling of cocaine and other drugs, an official said on Thursday.
